If you were a parent who accidentally found out your real child was not the one raised in your home, should you reclaim your child after he/she had recognized others as parents for so long?" In my opinion, it is better for the child to stay with the parents who have raised him/her well for years before he/she turns into an adult. Not only is such an arrangement good for the child's mental development but it could avoid the sufferings in both the biological and the non-biological families of the child.

Although some people think such children should be reunited with their biological family as soon as possible, a sudden reclaim may cause children's confusion. Since they know there can be a mistake about who their parents are, they may wonder whether all things around them will also turn out to be false. Difficulty in adjusting to a new environment will also happen when they are forced to stay in an unfamiliar biological family. Those problems are sure to have a negative influence on their mental development.

For the biological family, reclaiming the child may not be good news, either. Instead, it is likely to trigger all the trouble they are going to encounter. First, the family may have a hard time getting along with the child because there is nothing connecting the family and the reclaimed child except for their blood. In addition, while the parents focus most of their attention on the child as compensation for not being able to take good care of him/her, other children may start to hate the child because they think he/she robs them of their parents' love.

Compared with the biological family, the non-biological family may not suffer less after the reclaim. What they experience is like losing a dear child. After living together for so many years, the family and the child must have established a strong affection toward each other. Even though there is no blood relationship between them, it is really hard to erase all their shared memory.

To prevent second tragedy from happening, do not bother to reclaim the child after he/she has been raised in another family for years. Letting the child be where he/she has been is the best choice not only for the child but also for both families.
